Road Construction

Last stages of construction/ paving are coming to an end. Road is closed to the public; but the initial paving, curbing is done right through to Deer Park Elementary. Fawn Ridge to Sheldon section will be the first to open when the Key West culde-sac is closed and complete. No firm dates yet and we are told the county is looking at additional "traffic control measures" for the middle section that may push back the entire road opening. Confirmed that our upgraded 8 ft. privacy fencing is on order and installation should be in October.

Front Entrance

We have run into some Right of Way (ROW) and water easement issues we needed to resolve with our design plans on the west side monument /signage. They are solvable and should not affect our design plans significantly. Because of this and the near completion of that part of the intersection and walkways, we decided not to finalize our plans until we "see" the build out.

HURRICANE SEASON BE PREPARED

Driveways and Sidewalk Maintenance

Oil and Rust stains can be unsightly in the middle of your driveway and permanently parking your car over the stain is a poor way to disguise the problem. For oil stains, put down cat litter to absorb the oil, then brush away and cover with dry cement as it will absorb the oil and can then be brushed away. Older oil stains can be purged with a mixture of hydrated lime powder and turpentine, spread over the stain and covered with plastic then scrub with detergent and water after a day.

DON'T FEED THE ALLIGATORS

Is there any more prominent symbol of Florida than the Florida alligator? Found throughout the state, alligators are more plentiful ever given their protection under the law. We now have over one million alligators in Florida. Add to that the fact that we now have over 17 million people in Florida, and you have the right mix for more gator attacks on humans in this state. While alligators don't normally seem to think of adult humans as prey, who really knows what these massive, toothy holdovers of the dinosaur age think? Never trust a Florida alligator, or any alligator for that matter. They may lie around looking lifeless and lethargic, but they move with lightning burst of speed. If folks had any idea that an alligator can outrun a horse over a short distance, they'd probably be a lot more careful.

Bad situation, either for the gator, or infinitely worse, for a person who gets too close. It's bad for the gator because "a fed gator is a dead gator." Sooner or later a large menacing alligator will have to be destroyed. But if that gator actually attacks and kills someone, well, there's a tragedy none of us want even to think about, much less see or read about.
